Spiritual Fellowship at Oahu Convocation

The Hawaii Conference celebrated an Oahu Convocation from Sept. 22-23, 2017. Every congregation on the island joined for worship at Honolulu Central Church with special guest Elder Ricardo Graham, Pacific Union Conference President. Elder Graham shared three messages on the gospel, grace, and the transforming power of God.

Friday night began with a vespers service to open the Sabbath, with the Oahu pastors leading out in the service.

The Sabbath morning service saw the sanctuary brimming with attendance. Elder Ralph Watts, welcomed the congregation and reminded all of the Hawaii Conference mission: “Each One, Reach One.”

In the youth chapel, Pastor Erik VanDenburgh and his youth ministry team provided a service for youth and young adults, while not turning away those who may have been a little too young or old!
